He took us on a journey through his secondary education and the post-16 decisions he made. A work experience placement in Year 10 led Nick on to a Catering Apprenticeship when he left school, but after a year he felt it wasn't the future he wanted. At the time Nick said this was scary to admit and to have an uncertain future, but he took time to seek advice from past



teachers, the college and his family before moving to a Level 3 Sports course instead for two years which he absolutely loved.

After this he began a part-time job in the ticket office at AFC Bournemouth and over the years this developed to a full-time position. He now oversees ticketing at all home and away matches. Nick is even visiting Las Vegas next month as part of his job! Nick had a very positive attitude, not allowing any additional obstacles due to his significant hearing impairment to hold him back throughout his education and career journey. Thanks to Nick for taking the time to come and talk to us, we all found your talk very inspiring!
